

## Chlorine, chloramine topics of latest poll

How many public water systems disinfect with chlorine? With chloramine? With both? With neither?

A number of public water systems have in recent years switched some or all of their disinfection processes to the use of chloramine, which does not produce as many harmful disinfection byproducts as chlorine.

The latest *WaterTech Online*<sup>®</sup> poll asks readers who work in public water systems to reveal what kinds of disinfection are used in their systems. With five clickable answer options, respondents can say whether their water system uses chlorine only; chloramine only; both chlorine and chloramine; a disinfection method not including chlorine or chloramine; or no disinfection of any kind.
