

## **Company gets permits for tire recycling facility in Colo.**

Nov. 9 -- A rubber recycling company in Colorado has received full operational permits for a new tire recycling facility, the company said Monday.

Magnum Recycling USA, a subsidiary of Magnum D'Or Resources, Inc., received full operational permits and license authority for its Hudson, Colo., 120 acre Tire Landfill facility.

The facility will house a closed loop rubber recycling process.

Last week, the company received approval from county authorities for the Special Use Permit for operation of the Hudson Tire Landfill facility. The company can now accept scrap tires and begin installation and operation of a new rubber recycling plant.

The company estimates there are 40 million tires at the Colorado landfill. When complete the plant will recycle tires and scrap rubber into fine rubber powders and reactivated compounds that can be used in the production of new tires.
