

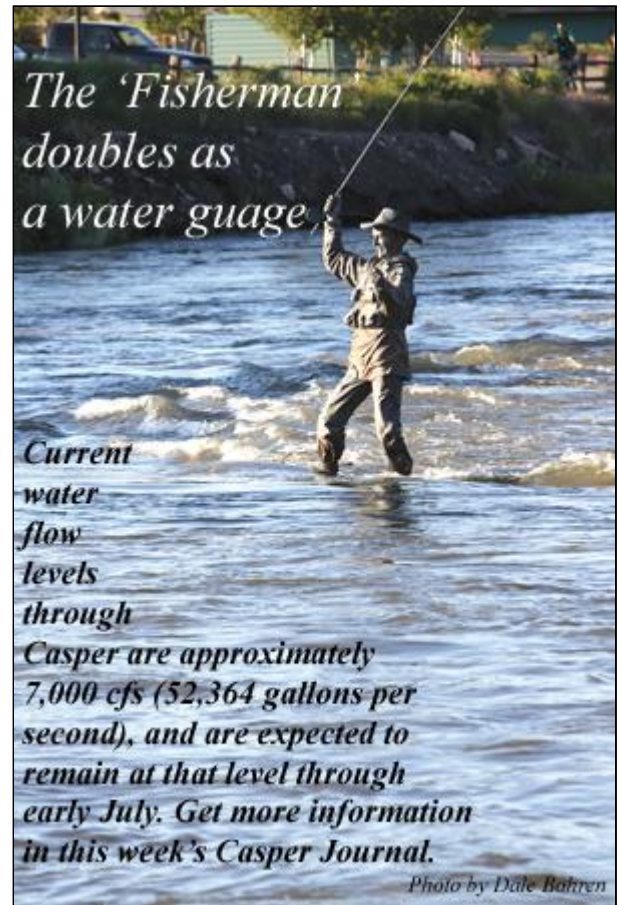
## The 'Fisherman' doubles as water gauge

Snowmelt runoff and rainfall flowing into the North Platte River above Casper have nearly filled all reservoirs in the system to capacity this year, according to the Wyoming Area Office of the Bureau of Reclamation. Approximately 4,000 of the 7,200 cubic feet per second (cfs) being released from Pathfinder Reservoir are spilling over the dam. Current water flow levels through Casper are approximately 7,000 cfs (52,364 gallons per second), and are expected to remain at that level through early July. The Bureau of Reclamation is advising the public to use caution with regard to rising reservoir levels, changing reservoir releases, and river flow conditions for the immediate future.
