

## **Trash Force on hand when the Saints go marching in**

Feb. 9 -- Huge crowds are expected to generate huge amounts of trash tonight as New Orleans celebrates its Super Bowl victory with a parade.

SDT Waste & Debris LLC handles trash collection for the French Quarter and downtown and said the company is implementing its Mardi Gras "Trash Force" to handle the expected huge crowds.
