

## Water purification technology receives EPA registration

AUBURN, AL — A water purification technology that was developed at Auburn University and now is marketed by Seattle, WA-based water technology company HaloSource Inc. has been granted US Environmental Protection Agency registration, according to a June *Laboratory Equipment* report.

Quoting information from the university, the report said that the technology, developed by Professor Dave Worley, is commercialized as HaloPure Br. The company pays royalties to the university through a technology transfer agreement.

Worley is quoted as saying that the EPA registration for the technology, marketed in a disinfecting cartridge to drinking water treatment equipment manufacturers, will provide assurance for manufacturers in other countries that the technology is "safe and proven."

HaloSource Senior Vice President and Chief Technology Officer Jeff Williams is quoted saying that potential end users for the technology include municipalities, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), Homeland Security and the military, as well as hikers, backpackers and campers, the report said.
